

Employment & Economic Stability: Eligible Project Objectives

CAG Amounts and Cycle

Initiatives led by local residents or small groups active in the Cooksville community.

The requested amount may be between \$5,000 - \$20,000 per project.

Expected to be delivered over a period of 6 months or less and completed by August 31, 2026.



Project Eligibility Criteria

Operate in Cooksville

Focus on Cooksville and project timeframe of 6 months or less Project have at least 5 residents submitting, with two identified as primary leads Deliver on at least 1 of the Grant Focus Areas



Primary Lead(s) Eligibility Criteria

Live in the Cooksville neighbourhood

↔ Should <u>not</u> be leading this grant as part of their employment

A resident can only be listed as the 'primary lead' once



Grassroots groups that do not have registered charity status with the CRA are eligible to apply in this grant stream



Must be willing to work with Indus Community Services as the project trustee



Agency Lead Eligibility Criteria



Have financial statements for at least 1 year (audited) or be trusteed by a registered charity that has financial statements for at least one year

Must operate in Cooksville and complete a collaborative agreement if applying as a collaborative



If revenue is less than \$100,000, have a review engagement for at least one fiscal year, conducted by a licensed public accountant



Only 1 application per project lead agency is eligible to be approved
