### Land Acknowledgement



#### Context

The Jane Finch Community Action Grants (CAG) are designed to support neighbourhood-focused initiatives that advance key community-informed priorities and actions. These priorities and actions are outlined in local plans such as the Jane Finch Community Development Plan (CDP).

Projects will support initiatives in Jane Finch with outcomes focused on improving one of five Grant Focus Areas

### Employment & Economic Benefits: Eligible Project Objectives



- Increasing local hiring, education & training opportunities
- Strengthening local workforce development models
- Evaluation efforts related to employment, economic development

### Community Safety & Well-Being: Eligible Project Objectives



- Increasing education on conflict resolution, violence prevention, violence intervention, & mental health
- Increasing local mentorship opportunities for youth impacted by, or involved in violence
- Creating collaborations that address mental health concerns related to safety


### Food Justice & Sovereignty: Eligible Project Objectives



- Increasing educational programs & workshops on topics that advance food justice and food sovereignty
- Supporting advocacy regarding food justice, sovereignty, & nutritious affordable food access

#### Vibrant Spaces: Eligible Project Objectives



- Increasing local festivals through expanded access to community outdoor space
- Contributing to more community-owned, stewarded &/or managed spaces
- Documenting & measuring local placekeeping efforts

### Anti-Displacement: Eligible Project Objectives



- Increasing community engagement activities that preserve gathering spaces, murals, etc.
- Conducting research &/or building capacity that support community ownership (i.e. community land trusts)
- Increasing education on tenant rights, and support for tenant led groups, eviction prevention

#### Successful CAG initiatives will:

✓Support residents, groups, and agencies to take action on community identified priorities.

✓Increase social cohesion, ensuring that priority populations can contribute to creating equitable communities.

✓ Foster and strengthen relationships between residents, partners, and other stakeholders

✓ Mobilize resources and collaborative activities for local priorities





### **Funding streams**



#### Resident/Grassroots

Initiatives led by local residents or small groups active in the Jane Finch community.

Projects may recieve between \$5,000 - \$20,000 All projects will be trusteed by Jane/Finch Centre

Expected to be delivered over a period of 6 months or less and completed by August 31, 2026.

Project have at least 5 residents submitting, with two identified as primary leads

Deliver on at least 1 of the Grant Focus Areas.


### Agency/Collaborative

Projects or initiatives will be led by a local agency, collaborative or group of partners in Jane Finch

The requested amount may range from \$25,000 to \$75,000 per project

Projects expected to be delivered over a period of up to 18 months (i.e. completed by May 31<sup>st</sup>, 2027).

### Agency/Collaborative Project Eligibility Criteria









Lead must operate in Jane Finch (Black Creek and Glenfield Jane Heights)


Occur within 18 months

Project may be part of a broader initiative but must include activities in Jane Finch. Project must seek to deliver on one (1) of the Grant Focus Areas.

### **Agency Lead Eligibility Criteria**



Is a registered charitable organization, or an incorporated non-profit organization\* for a minimum of 2 years





Must operate in Jane Finch and complete a collaborative agreement if applying as a collaborative



If revenue is less than \$100,000, have a review engagement for at least one fiscal year, conducted by a licensed public accountant.



Only 1 application per project lead agency is eligible to be approved

### Agency/Collaborative Application Process

Applications are available as of **June 9th 2025** 

To request access to SMA application, contact CAG@uwgt.org by September 5<sup>th</sup> with subject line 'Jane Finch CAG – SMA Set Up'

Applicants must use Survey Monkey Apply (SMA) to complete and submit the application by September 12<sup>th</sup> 2025

#### **Agency/Collaborative Application Questions**



Lead organization info (incorporation or non-qualified donee information, Black/Indigenous led, 50/30 challenge)



If a collaborative application or have project partners, who are the partners and what are their roles?



How does your org/collaborative engage with and outreach to residents and other grassroots groups?



Who are your partners for this project and what are their roles?



Will residents be involved in leadership roles? If so, how many and provide info on their roles.



### Resident / Grassroots Group Application Questions



Contact info for 5-7 residents



Are you submitting as a grassroots group?



How do you plan to engage residents in your project?



Are you working with any other partners in the community to implement your project?

### Questions in both applications

- What is the geographic focus of your project?
- Will your project work with a specific population?
- Briefly describe your group's experience working in <u>Black Creek</u> and/or <u>Glenfield Jane Heights</u>?
- Identify grant focus area
- Provide a summary of the project.
- What does your project hope to accomplish?
- Project Start and End dates

### Grantee advice: The Neighbourhood Group (Agency stream)

"I find that project planning and budgets are two documents that go hand and hand.

Your activities are dependent on your budget and vice versa. I find it helpful to envision what I would like to accomplish and then sketch out a budget."





### **Project Plan and Evaluation**

Project Plan	<b>Evaluation Plan</b>	
Steps (for outreach, implementation & evaluation)	What are the goals of your project and how do they relate to the grant focus area?	
Who will be doing it? (to be completed by resident(s), a partner or other?)	How will you know if you have been successful?	
When will it be completed? (timeframe for completion)	What information do you need to demonstrate the results of your project? How will you collect it?

### **Project Selection Process**



The Review Committee for Round 2 will be comprised of up to ten (10) members with a minimum of five Jane Finch residents, as well as other key stakeholders.



Review Committee members will provide the slate of recommended projects to UWGT for final approval.

"Center the voices of those you're serving. Let the community lead and guide you—they know what works. Don't be afraid to start small and build."




