The Bay Mills Neighbourhood

365 Bay Mills is located in the Steeles-L'Amoreaux community of North Scarborough and can be found off Birchmount, just north of Sheppard. Almost 63.1 per cent of the population are newcomers to Canada and bring with them a rich collection of cultures that make the community vibrant. But the area also

faces barriers to reaching its full potential. There is a high concentration of poverty, with 14.6 per cent of families living on low incomes. The youth population (15-24) is 11.9 per cent and youth lack access to safe public spaces, programs and services, and face a high unemployment rate.

16.9% is the unemployment rate for the neighbourhood compared to 13.8% for the city as a whole.
