The Neighbourhood of Weston & Mt. Dennis

Situated in the area of Weston Road and Jane Street, Weston-Mt. Dennis is one of Toronto's oldest communities. It boasts strong, engaged residents who are proud of their neighbourhood and interested in building a strong network of connections. But it is also a neighbourhood that

struggles. The decline of local employment in the area has brought about additional challenges for residents who face barriers to finding employment. Poverty is concentrated in the area with 17.1 per cent of residents living on low incomes.

Jane Street Community Hub

Size: 20,000 Square Feet

Opened: October 2010

Agencies in Hub: Unison Health and Community Services (lead agency)

Services: Accessible health care services (including doctors, nurses, preventative services, counselling and access to professional interpretation services); programs and services for youth, including counselling, nutrition programs and community engagement activities; early childhood development programs; and employment and settlement services for newcomers.

Since it opened its doors, the Hub has had a significant impact in the community (updated as of Mar. 2025):

528,349

The total number of visits that have been made to the Hub, giving a sense of how many community members are making use of vital programs and services at the Hub.

107,219

The number of visits to the Hub by children who accessed programs and services.

8,110

The number of times community space was used for a wide variety of activities, reinforcing the vital role of the Hub in providing accessible space to residents.

158,322

The number of times residents have participated in activities in the community space at the Hub, demonstrating how the Hub provides opportunities for residents to connect and participate in local events.
