## The Neighbourhoods of Eglinton **East-Kennedy Park**

Eglinton East-Kennedy Park is located in the Eglinton Avenue and Brimley Avenue area of Scarborough. Almost 57.6 per cent of the population are immigrants to Canada and bring with them a rich collection of cultures that make the community vibrant. But the area also

faces barriers to reaching its full potential. There is a high concentration of poverty, with 15.3 per cent of families living on low incomes. The youth population at 12.8 percent lack access to safe public spaces, programs and services, and face a high unemployment rate.

17.6% is the unemployment rate for the neighbourhood compared to 13.8% for the city as a whole.
