The Neighbourhood of Mount Olive-Silverstone-Jamestown

Mount Olive-Silverstone-Jamestown, the largest neighbourhood in Rexdale, is located in the far northwestern corner of Toronto. The community is sub-divided by wide roads and green belts surrounding the Humber River. The community has a diverse population including South and East Asians, South Americans and people from

the Middle East, which can contribute to language and cultural barriers. Poverty is concentrated in specific pockets in the neighbourhood and 26.5 per cent of people live in core housing need compared to the City average of 19.6 per cent meaning many families struggle to succeed.

15.5% of families are living

on low incomes.

41.9% of the neighbourhood population has postsecondary education. (62.4% City-wide)



16% of the neighbourhood population are youth ages 15-24.
