The Neighbourhoods of Thorncliffe Park & Flemington Park

Thorncliffe Park and Flemington Park are located in the Overlea & Don Mills area of East York. Almost 62.5 per cent of the population are newcomers to Canada and bring with them a rich collection of cultures that make the community vibrant. But the area also faces

barriers to reaching its full potential. There is a high concentration of poverty, with 22.9 per cent of families living on low incomes and 75.7 per cent of the community are renters. The youth population is high at 13 per cent and youth lack access to safe public spaces, programs and services, and face a high unemployment rate.

17.3% is the unemployment rate for the neighbourhood compared to 13.8% for the city as a whole.
